STATELESSNESS AND Migrant CHILDREN

PHYSICAL AND HUMILIATING PUNISHMENT

RPA on EVAC	
- Pool and share information on RPA and its implementation including the matrix on analysis of legal frameworks, gaps on VAC, and agencies tasked to implement the RPA done by UNICEF - Issue statement regarding the Philippine House Bills on lowering the Minimum Age of Criminal Responsibility (MACR) and Death Penalty in relation to the RPA o EVAC	LEAD: CRC Asia
MONITORING AND REPORTING	
- Update members on the most-recent reporting processes and formats - Facilitate in the organizing of a training in the region on the new reporting processes and monitoring of concluding observations with the help of Child Rights Connect, Ms. Yasmeen Shariff, and Ms. Mikiko Otani - Continue advocating for the OP3 CRC	LEAD: CRC Asia
